Harry Bryce has, for over thirty years, developed visionary works as a director, choreographer, writer, and arts educator. Born and raised in Richmond Virginia now living in Sarasota Florida, Bryce was Artist in Residence at the Vinnette Carroll Repertory Theatre in Fort Lauderdale during the 1980's and received a 1989 Florida Carbonnell Award nomination in choreography for Ms. Carroll's production of I'm Laughing But I Ain't Tickled. He has lead dance companies in Richmond, Virginia and Atlanta where his original concert ballet Beyond the Canebreaks: Moments In the Life of Harriet Tubman performed to sell-out crowds and received national and critical acclaim at the National Black Arts Festival. In 1997, Mr. Bryce founded the Memphis Black Repertory Theatre and served as producing artistic director for five seasons. He produced and directed twenty-one productions for MBRT including Having Our Say, Blues for An Alabama Sky, Shakin' the Mess Outta Misery, The Old Settler, Dreamgirls, Once On This Island, Ain't Misbehavin', Spunk, Five Guys Named Moe, and The Black Nativity, garnering seventeen theatre awards. A director in demand, Bryce has directed for theatres throughout the United States including Northern Stage Theatre in Vermont, Bijou Theatre in Knoxville, TN, Cumberland County Playhouse in TN, Orpheum Theatre in Memphis, Virginia Center for The Performing Arts, 14th Street Playhouse in Atlanta GA. Seaside Music Theatre in Daytona Beach, Riverside Theatre in Bradenton FL, Historic Asolo Theatre in Sarasota FL. Mr. Bryce is the recipient of the 2000 Carter G, Woodson Award of Merit for Lifetime Achievements in Performing Arts.


